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| Chablis 1er Cru
Cote de Lechet 2013, France
A Premier Cru Chablis with wide appeal from well know producer, La Chablisienne. Inviting lemon-lime nose and a hint of white flowers. | £68 |
| Domaine Bitouzet Prieur Meursault Clos Du Cromin
Cote de Beaune, France
A beautifully distinct wine from Burgundy, with a refreshing character that hints at minerals and lemon. | £79 |
| Domaine Bitouzet Prieur Puligny Montrachet
Cote de Beaune, France
Rich and creamy texture with notes of baked white fruits and roasted pineapple, with a fragrant, clean and mineral finish. | £90 |
| La Petite Cote 2015 - Yves Cuilleron
Rhone Valley, France
From the South/Southeast-facing vines in terraces over looking the village of Chavanay. Exuberant and pleasant on the nose full of fruit candied apricot and peach. Yves Cuilleron is a leading figure in the Northern Rhone and this is one of the finest examples of Viognier in France. | £110 |

Gervey-Chambertin Pinot Noir £59
Domaine Lucien Jacob 2004

Our exclusive Gevrey-Chambertin En Songe comes from a tiny parcel of vines within the famous appellation of Gevrey-Chambertin in the Côte de Nuits. A classical Pinot Noir expression with delicate raspberry and cherry fruit, overlaid with exotic spices from the extended barrel ageing. Known for being quite foursquare in youth, Jean-Michel Jacob's Gevrey has aged gracefully

Château L'Arrosée £82
Grand Cru Classé Saint-Emilion 2007

A restrained, almost Burgundian effort in 2007 that is now offering some lovely development. Sweet exotic spices, notes of forest floor, damp earth, cedar and fruit-cake; fleshy with some austerity, fine-tannins and a long dry finish.

Bourgogne Pinot Noir £90
Ghislaine Barthod 2014

Very pretty, silky, open and generous on the nose, offering gorgeously perfumed berry fruits, and notes of pressed violets. Medium-bodied, fleshy and intense with a beguiling sweetness balanced by a touch of rusticity. A wonderful introduction to a superlative grower.

La Gravette de Certan £100
Pomerol 2013

The second wine of Vieux Château Certan, from this infamous, tricky vintage. On the elegant side of medium-bodied, with typically attractive aromas of raspberry, strawberry and cassis. There are crisp, leafy elements and a certain earthy, cedary quality that tie-in to ample richness. A wine of excellent balance and poise, and an example of how to follow the producer, rather than the vintage!

Chambolle-Musigny £130
Ghislaine Barthod 2013

Perfectly elegant, well-defined and complex. Mulchy earth, gamey meat and heady blue and black fruits, liqueur-like flourishes and sweet floral elements. An energetic wine with real verve; sweet black cherry on the attack, becoming a little more bitter towards the finish, with mineral and earthy flavours throughout. Delicious now, with great promise for the future.

Chateau Pichon Longueville £300
Comtesse De Lalande 1999

From the famous Chateau Pichon Lelande Estate, one of the best examples of Bordeaux from Pauillac. A delicate and refined red with sensuous textures. Fresh aromas of raspberries and minerals follow through to a medium-bodied palate, with fine tannins and a delicate, refreshing finish. Better with age.
